# Effects of Nationality

## TITLE 01 — NATIONALITY · CHAPTER 01 — GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 1 The possession of Kaharagian nationality establishes personal status under the laws of the State and entitles the national to:
  - a. Recognition in civil matters recorded by the State.
  - b. Eligibility for national honours and heraldic registrations.
  - c. Eligibility to participate in the assemblies, consultations, and civic activities of the State.
  - d. The benefit of the rights and protections that Kaharagian law confers upon nationals.
- 2 Nationality carries with it the obligations prescribed by the Fundamental Laws and the laws of the State, including the duties of allegiance set forth in the Fundamental Laws.
- 3 The civil effects of nationality upon personal capacity, status, and juridical acts are governed by the Civil Code.
- 4 A national may exercise civic and cultural participation through any means established by the State, regardless of place of residence.
